Bruce Cull's art in upcoming New York exhibition

NEW YORK CITY (Staff/Special) – New York City's Agora Gallery is featuring some of the works of Coleman Township artist Bruce Cull in an upcoming group exhibition.

The natural environment and mankind's relations with the environment are subjects Mr. Cull challenges viewers to consider through his art, Agora Gallery states in announcing the exhibition March 6 to 27.

An opening reception will take place Thursday, March 8 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

"His use of line and form dominate each canvas, resulting in compositions both rhythmic and dynamic, yet profoundly balanced," the gallery states in a press release.

Mr. Cull is quoted as stating his art is "a passionate creative expression of our connection and relationship to our environment and consequently to one another."

Mr. Cull's mixed media paintings combine "traditional paints and techniques with other textured materials such as wire, eggshells, wasps' nests and rhubarb leaves," the gallery stated.

The gallery noted that Mr. Cull's work "is rooted in drawing and design" but is also "inspired by sculpting and printmaking techniques."

The gallery also noted Mr. Cull's ancestral background of French, Irish and Mohawk which "have profoundly connected him to the land, and it is from this deep connection that his art evolves."

Other artists whose work will be seen in the exhibition, *In Reverie of Form*, are: Annik, Marie Anne Baron, Tom Byrne, Gilbert Cantu, Carolina Ferrara, Steve Mason, Nataixa Ros, Jaime Sánchez Nava, Tanya, Elena Vasileva, and Lilina C. Williams.

Agora Gallery is a fine art gallery established in 1984 and located at 530 West 25th St., New York City, in the heart of New York City's Chelsea art galleries district.
